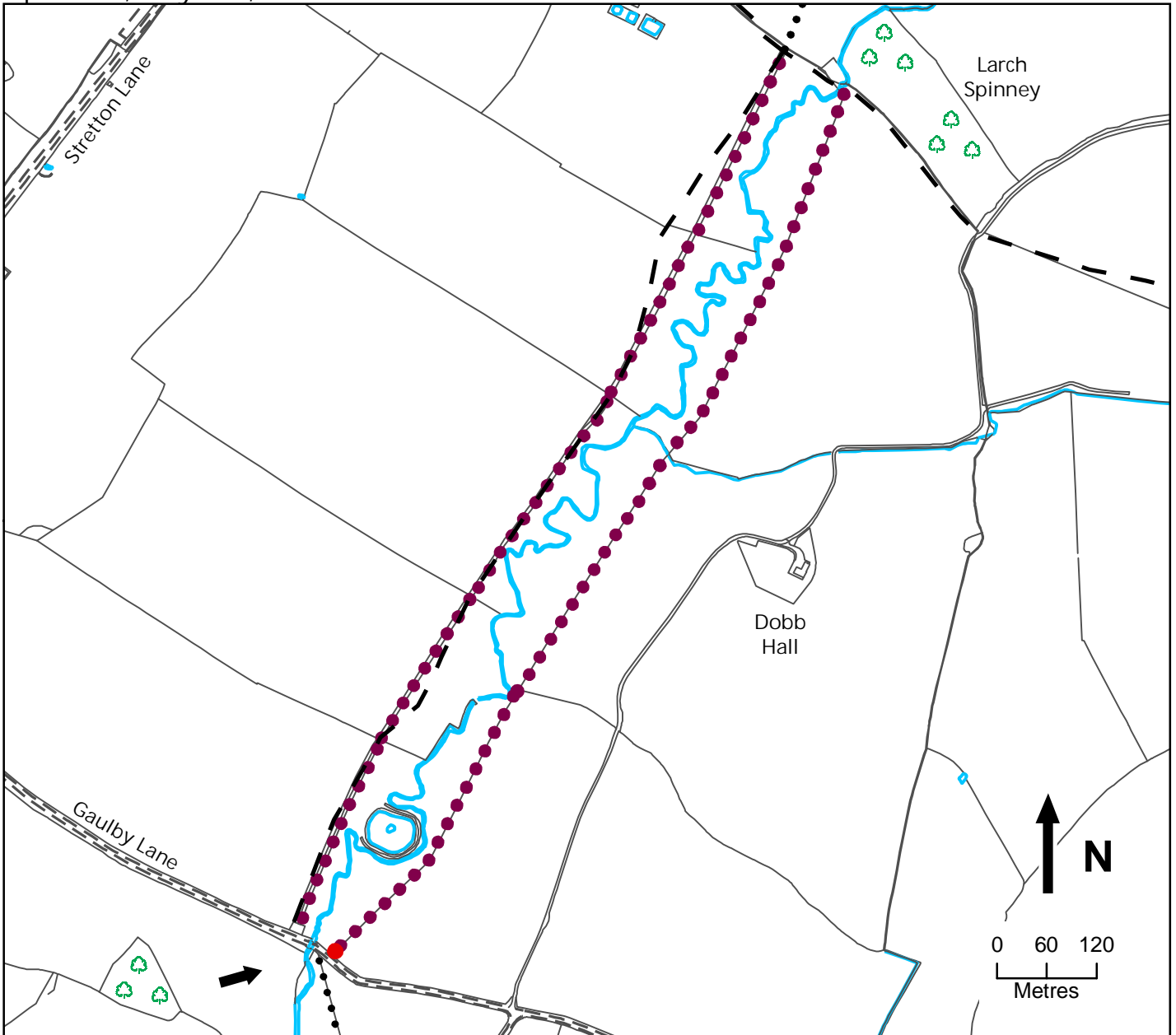


PERMISSIVE ACCESS

This permissive footpath is one of many circular routes provided under the Higher Level Stewardship Scheme. These areas of grassland are being managed specifically to encourage insect activity. During the walk along the river, you may be lucky enough to see dragonfly species such as Broad bodied Chaser (*Libellula depressa*), the 4-spotted Chaser (*Libellula quadrimaculata*) and the Banded Demoiselle (*Calopteryx splendens*) as well as bird species such as Lapwing, Tree-Sparrow, Skylark, Yellowhammer.
